## Scripture and the Mass

It is clear that Sacred Scripture has a revered and important place in the Eucharistic Liturgy. Every Mass includes a Liturgy of the Word. The main elements of the Liturgy of the Word are biblical readings and the singing of the psalm. The Liturgy of the Word reaches its high point in the proclamation of the Gospel. However, the use of Scripture in the Mass does not end when the Liturgy of the Word has finished. In fact, the words of Scripture flow throughout the prayers of the Mass. One of the goals of the new translation of the *Roman Missal* is to make clearer the links between the prayers of Mass and the texts of Scripture.

## This Week's Saints

**MONDAY † Saint Elizabeth of Portugal** was the queen of Portugal, but never allowed her affluent lifestyle to blind her from those on the margins of society, especially the sick, the poor, and prostitutes. She was the mother of two and yet she managed to build hospitals, orphanages, and schools while spending numerous hours in daily prayer. After the death of her husband, King Denis, she became a Franciscan tertiary, devoting her life to simplicity and good works. Throughout her life she became well known for her peacemaking skills, most importantly when she prevented a war between Portugal and Castile.

**TUESDAY † Saint Anthony Mary Zaccaria** served northern Italy as a doctor before becoming a priest. Inspired by the writings of Saint Paul, he founded a religious order known as the Barabites who sought to foster a profound love and respect of the sacramental life of the Church, while taking care of plague victims and the poor. He also assisted in establishing the Angelic Sisters of Saint Paul, a congregation of women committed to works of mercy, most importantly preventing women from falling prey to prostitution.

**WEDNESDAY † Saint Maria Goretti**, a simple young girl born to poor farmers in Italy, she demonstrated a piety and zeal uncharacteristic of someone her age. Her life ended prematurely when she was murdered by a young man named Alessandro, because she would not succumb to his sexual advances. Before dying, she forgave her attacker. He repented and was at her canonization, along with her family, as she was declared a martyr for chastity.

**SATURDAY † Saint Augustine Zhao Rong**, a Chinese soldier, was drawn to the Catholic faith by the holy example of Bishop Dufresse whom he escorted to Beijing. After converting to the faith he was ordained to the priesthood and began evangelizing the Christian faith. Given the opportunity to refute his faith, he remained firm in his faith and died a heinous death, along with 119 other companion martyrs, under the tyrannical reign of Emperor Kia-Kin.
