Liturgical Reflection on the Revised Missal:

Holy Communion

Immediately before coming forward to receive the Lord in Holy Communion, the new translation of the **Roman Missal** will have us say, “*Lord, I am not worthy that you should come under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.*” This prayer quotes the words of the centurion who asked Jesus to cure his servant. He would not presume to ask Jesus to come to his home. He trusted in the authority of the Lord’s healing word (Matthew 8:8 and Luke 7:6-7). This new phrasing reminds us that, in receiving Holy Communion, we are to model the centurion’s humility and faith.

This Week's Saints

MONDAY † **Saint Camillus de Lellis** (1550–1614). Putting aside a life of violence and gambling, Camillus was ordained a priest and later founded the Order of Clerks Regular Ministers to the Sick (the Camillians). Whether ministering in a hospital or tending to the wounded on the battlefield, the order was easily identified by their black habit with a large red cross on the breast. Camillus is credited with many innovations in health care: diet, ventilation, isolation of infectious disease, field ambulances, military hospitals. Naturally, he is patron saint of hospitals, nurses, and the sick.

WEDNESDAY † **Saint Apollinaris** (453–520) is thought to have been appointed Bishop of Ravenna, but there is little evidence to support this claim; in fact, there is very little dependable information about his life in general, but he was venerated as a martyr in the early Church.

THURSDAY † **Saint Lawrence of Brindisi** (1559–1619), a Capuchin Franciscan in Italy, was an astute scripture scholar. His comprehensive knowledge of scripture enabled him to be an effective and powerful preacher. He was declared a doctor of the Church due to his extensive writings, and he served the Capuchins in many leadership roles, culminating in minister general of the order.

FRIDAY † **Saint Mary Magdalene** is one of the most misunderstood women of the Bible. She has been confused since medieval times with Mary of Bethany (sister of Martha and Lazarus) and the sinful woman who washes Jesus’ feet with her hair. What we do know is that Jesus healed her, and that she was the first witness of his Resurrection. She has therefore been called the “Apostle to the Apostles.”

SATURDAY † **Saint Bridget of Sweden** (1303–1373), a wife and mother of eight children, joined a Cistercian monastery after the death of her husband. Following a series of visions, she founded the Bridgettine Order (a double monastery for men and women living in separate enclosures) dedicated to learning. In another vision, she was instructed to heal the schism of the Avignon papacy by warning Pope Clement VI to return to Rome from Avignon. She was canonized for her heroic virtue.
