## Liturgical Reflection on the Revised Missal: Holy Communion

What is new about the revised translation of the third edition of the **Roman Missal**? The style of the translation is different. In accord with the rules of translation established by the Holy See, the revised translation follows the style of the original Latin texts more closely, including concrete images, repetition, parallelisms, and rhythm. The English used in the Mass texts is more formal and dignified in style. Where possible, the texts follow the language of Scripture and include many poetic images. In addition, the third edition contains prayers for the celebration of recently canonized saints, additional prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayers, additional Masses and prayers for various needs and intentions, and some updated and revised instructions for the celebration of Mass.

## This Week's Saints

**MONDAY † Saint James** is the brother of the apostle John, one of the "sons of thunder" (Mark 3:17) who were privileged witnesses of some of Jesus' greatest signs: the raising of the daughter of Jairus from the dead, the transfiguration, the agony in the garden. James (not to be confused with a younger James to whom is attributed a beautiful letter in the New Testament) was the first apostle to suffer martyrdom, slain by Herod's orders as described in Acts. Legend has it that his remains were carried away by friends in a rudderless boat which drifted to Spain where a great cathedral, still popular as a pilgrimage destination today, was built.

**TUESDAY † Saint Joachim and Saint Anne**, parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary, are portrayed as an old and barren couple who long to bring life into the world. Through an angelic messenger they are told they will bear a child—not just any child, but one who will be revered for all time. Unfortunately, the information we have comes from an unreliable source known as the Gospel of James. Saint Anne has a strong following, especially in Canada. She is the patron of childless women, expectant mothers, and women in labor.

**FRIDAY † Saint Martha** from Bethany, the sister of Lazarus who was raised from the dead by Jesus. Her faith is evident as she says "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world" (John 11:1-44) and in her action as she serves Jesus a meal while Mary anoints his feet just prior to his Passion (John 12:1-8). She is the patron of those working in the hospitality field, including cooks, waiters and hotel managers.

**SATURDAY † Saint Peter Chrysologus** (380–450), born in northeastern Italy, was appointed Archbishop of Ravenna by Emperor Valentinian III. His orthodox approach to the Incarnation and other Church doctrines earned him the support of Pope Saint Leo the Great. He was given the title "Chrysologus," meaning "Golden-worded," due to his flair for preaching (the Eastern Church has Saint John Chrysostom meaning "Golden-tongued"). Most of his writings did not survive, except for some sensitive and optimistic sermons which challenge people to conversion and repentance.
