Liturgical Reflection on the Revised Missal:

Liturgies of the Mass

The holy sacrifice of the Mass consists of the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Introductory Rites begin the Liturgy of the Word. The Liturgy of the Eucharist consists of the Eucharistic Prayer, Communion Rite, and Concluding Rite. The revised **Roman Missal** will follow these parts of the Mass which the Church set forth at the Second Vatican Council. The Mass remains the same in ritual; however, the Mass will change in translation this Advent.
