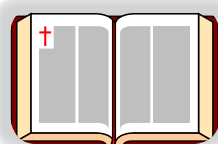

### Liturgical Reflection on the Revised Missal:

## Posture During Mass

Using our entire being in prayer helps us pray with greater attentiveness. In the early Church, kneeling signified penance. So thoroughly was kneeling identified with penance that early Christians were forbidden to kneel on Sundays and during the Easter season. In the Middle Ages kneeling came to signify homage, and more recently this posture has come to signify adoration, especially before the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It is for this reason that the bishops of this country have chosen the posture of kneeling for the entire Eucharistic Prayer. Sitting is the posture of listening and meditation, so the assembly sits for the pre-Gospel readings and the homily, and may also sit for the period of meditation following Communion.

## This Week's Saints

**MONDAY † Saint Anthony Mary Claret** (1807–1870). As a successful weaver and skilled printer in Spain, Anthony felt called to be ordained a priest and preach parish missions. He eventually gathered young men together in community to preach missions, which led to the foundation of a new religious congregation called the Claretians. Later in life he was appointed Archbishop of Santiago, Cuba, a hugh diocese with many problems, including racism, slavery, and anti-Christian persecution. His Christian response to the problems (for example, credit unions to loan money to the poor) resulted in 15 assassination attempts upon his life. Following his tenure as Bishop, he served as confessor to Queen Isabella II and was able to exert his influence in the court to implement new projects, such as starting a natural history museum and schools of music and languages.

**FRIDAY † Saint Simon and Saint Jude.** Today we honor two apostles about whom we know very little. Tradition maintains that Saint Simon the Zealot (the Zealots were a radical group, plotting to overthrow the Roman occupiers) preached missions throughout Persia and Egypt. Saint Jude, not to be confused with Judas Iscariot, was likely a resistance fighter. It is ironic that the apostle about whom we probably know less than any other should be one of the most popular; as the patron saint of hopeless or lost causes, Saint Jude, called Thaddeus in the Gospel according to Matthew and the Gospel according to Mark, is a favorite. It is believed that he engaged in missionary work in Mesopotamia and Persia. Both Saints Simon and Jude are thought to have been martyred in Persia, and their relics were transferred to Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome sometime during the seventh and eighth centuries.
