### Liturgical Reflection:

## The Liturgy and Silence

“Silence in the Liturgy allows the community to reflect on what it has heard and experienced, and to open its heart to the mystery celebrated” (*Sing to the Lord*, no. 118). We gather at the beginning of Mass in silence, taking time to separate ourselves from the concerns of the world and enter into the sacred action of liturgy. We reflect on the readings in silence and following the homily observe quiet reverence. We may take time for silent reflection and prayer after everyone has received Communion. These times of silence are opportunities for us to enter more deeply in what God is doing in the Mass, and, like Mary, to keep “all these things, reflecting on them” in our hearts (Luke 2:19).
